

The Story Of The Nutcracker

Our Nutcracker ballet is inspired by the story "The Nutcracker and the King of Mice," written by E.T.A. Hoffman and set to a musical score composed by Peter Ilyich Tchaikovsky. Tchaikovsky was a famous Russian composer in the late 1800s, who also composed *Swan Lake* and *The Sleeping Beauty* Ballets.

The Party Scene

It is Christmas Eve at the Stahlbaum house, and they are hosting their annual Christmas party for their relatives and friends. Their children, Clara and Fritz, are dancing and playing with their cousins and guests.

Godfather Drosselmeyer arrives. He is a skilled clock and toymaker, always full of surprises. The children are given gifts, and Drosselmeyer presents special presents to Clara and Fritz. Although his gift to Fritz is admired by all of Fritz's friends, he gives Clara a beautiful Nutcracker that everyone is enamored by.

As the evening grows late, the friends depart and the Stahlbaum family retires for the evening. Clara, worried about her beloved Nutcracker, sneaks back to the Christmas tree to check on him, falling asleep with him in her arms.

The Battle Scene

As the clock strikes midnight, strange things begin to happen. The room fills with an army of mice, led by the fierce Mouse King. The Nutcracker awakens, becoming lifesize, and leads his army of toy soldiers into battle with the mice. The Mouse King corners the Nutcracker and battles him

Clara makes a final daring charge at the Mouse King, hitting him with her slipper. The Mouse King drops to the floor and the mice scamper away, carrying off their leader's lifeless body.

The Story Of The Nutcracker Continued

The Enchanted Pine Forest

Drosselmeyer turns The Nutcracker into a Prince and takes Clara on a journey to the Enchanted Pine Forest, a magical forest wonderland where they are welcomed by the Snow Queen and dancing snowflakes.

The Kingdom of Sweets

Drosselmeyer then escorts Clara to the Kingdom of Sweets, where she is greeted by the Sugar Plum Fairy, Sugar Rose, Ribbon Candy, and Arch Angel. Clara tells the kingdom about The Nutcracker's daring battle with the Mouse King and the Sugar Plum Fairy crowns Clara for her bravery. In celebration, Clara is then entertained by an array of dances.

The Dream Ends

Clara reluctantly awakens from her dream and finds herself once again with her beloved Nutcracker.

Guest Artist



Bizzie Adams began her dance training in Seattle, Washington, at The British Dancing Academy, where she studied ballet, modern, jazz, and contemporary styles. She completed the RAD examinations with distinction, earning recognition at showcases and conventions. Biz attended the University of Nevada Las Vegas (UNLV), where she obtained a double major in Dance Production and Management as well as Dance Performance and Choreography. During her time at UNLV, she studied and trained under renowned choreographers from companies such as Christopher Huggins, Cirque du Soleil artists such as Alex Yonkcovich, members of the Martha Graham Company, and dancers from Nevada Ballet Theatre. Biz concentrated on multimedia dance, expanding her expertise by working on larger-scale multimedia dance productions. She designed lighting, digital projections, and videography for numerous choreographic works across the West Coast.

Before graduating in December 2022 with recognition as an "Outstanding Graduating Senior" from the UNLV Department of Dance, Biz joined the State Street Ballet Company Trainee program. While at State Street Ballet, she toured to exciting locations including all along the west coast of California to Japan. Biz graduated with a knowledge Business Administration studies and a certification in Athletic Pilates under Dolly Kelepecz. She is currently a company Dancer with Joshua Grant's Dance Theatre Seattle and teaches as an instructor with their partner training school Dance Conservatory Seattle.

He is a member of several competitive B-boy groups – 2x world champion Massive Monkees, DVS Crew, and what was the Seattle SuperSonics Boom Squad. Massive Monkees is the 1st American crew to win the title of R-16 B-Boy Master World Champions in Korea.

Jeromeskee has participated in, judged, and won numerous B-boy events on almost every continent. He was a featured performer on Dancing With The Stars, the MTV Video Music Awards and Europe Music Awards, competed on MTV's America's Best Dance Crew, and was one of the coaches on MTV's "MADE: I Want To Be A B-boy." He is part of the team that choreographed and appeared in the award-winning music video, "Downtown," for Macklemore and Ryan Lewis and choreographed for and performed live with Macklemore, all around the world. He has danced in commercials and on TV, including The Ellen Show, Jimmy Kimmel Live!, The Tonight Show Starring Jimmy Fallon, and The Today Show.

Mr. Jerome is passionate about inspiring the next generation, passing along his wisdom, and instilling a growth mindset in all of his students. He also recently founded the non-profit organization, Breaking Boundaries.
